
All My Apples

- iPad Pro 11" (third iPad)
 - Resisted buying Apple, was convinced to
- iPhone 14 Pro (second iPhone)
 - Having iPad, obvious smartphone choice
- Apple Watch Series 9 (second Watch)
 - Wouldn't have bought, cardio study provided
- Three HomePods (one, two more, for Siri)
- Dozen+ AirTags

iPad/iPhone Home App

- Start slow, add incrementally as needed
- Easy setup: define zones/rooms/devices
 - My office: lamp and printer
 - Family room: lamps named Gabe and Kim
 - Basement: lamp
 - Dozen+ Christmas decorations including "Tree"
- iPad/iPhone Control Center
- Siri (speaker, iPhone, iPad, Watch) control
- Set shortcuts, triggers, automation, people, schedule, scenes (device/action groups)

Home App – HomeKit Framework



Small/Smart HomePod Minis

- Office, family room, basement
- Easy setup; plugged in so no charging
- Stream TV channel audio, TuneIn, etc.
- Good Siri hearing needn't raise voice
- Ping/locate devices (same as other Siris)
- Control smart home, play intercom msgs
- Update automatically

Managing Devices

- Some "smart" needs Internet for operation
- HomeKit code identifies devices
- Components need WiFi for control/actions
- Label components (outlet controls, etc.)
- Local device backup button control
- Setup requires app/devices share network
- Note WiFi 2.4/5 GHz networks speed/reach
 - ...or Bluetooth

Devices Controlled

- My outlets
 - Easy setup look for "Works with Apple"
 - Have manufacturer app but didn't need
 - QR code identifies device to Home app
 - Place in desired room and assign name
 - Easy to move/rename/repurpose
- Add lights, cameras, doorbells, locks, fans, faucets, sensors, sprinklers, windows, garage doors, switches, A/C, etc.

Smarter Home (?)

- Fuzzy smart home definition
- Smart bulbs, cypherlock, thermostat
- Faucets, sprinklers
- Security (cameras, lights, alarms)
- Windows, shades
- Garage door, doorbell
- Sensors (temperature, motion, open/close)

Find My App: Where's My Stuff?

- Sep 2022, iPhone 6s Plus → iPhone 14
 - Enabled more precise location detection
- iCloud and crowdsourced devices to track
 - Devices (iPad, iPhone, Watch)
 - Items (keys/hats/portfolio/purse/car) via AirTag
 - Other objects (AirPods, Beats devices, more
 - People (wife) with permission via iPhone
 - Me (locations)
- Can share item visibility


Flexible Tracking

- First few AirTags: keys, portfolio
- Then: hats, cars, suitcases, purse
- Nice "left behind" alerts: quick response
 - Watch taps if separated from object
 - Walk to restaurant, alerts if object left in car
 - Knows to NOT alert I've left car behind!
 - Would have saved round trip fetching item
 - Define safe place(s) e.g., home, no alerts


Usage

- Purse left in train station needed AirTag
- AirTag in car, car seemed stuck in Lorton
 - Wasn't mystery resolved: wife's car washed
 - AirTag dislodged from above windshield
 - Picked up by vacuum cleaner, put in trash
 - Trash collected, AirTag to Lorton landfill to die
- Three Watch apps: Devices, Items, People
- iCloud Find My app locates devices/audio
- Can trigger sound from AirTag




Find My App -- Items

Details

- Dark Side of Tracking -- Stalking
 - Sharing objects/location has consent levels
 - Location notifications require consent
 - Unknown item traveling with you alerts
- AirTag maintenance
 - Batteries last a year, Home app signals replace
 - Occasional software updates
 - Check Home app, bring AirTag near iPhone
